


<b>Investment Objective</b>	The investment objective of the scheme is to provide capital appreciation or income distribution by investing in companies from Leading Sectors, depending upon their growth prospects and sustainability of future earnings growth.

<b>Investment Strategy of the Scheme</b>	<p>The fund shall follow a combination of Top Down and Bottom up approach to investing in equities/related stocks in focused sectors across capitalization. Within such a framework, the emphasis will be on investing in companies with quality management, unique business strength, sustainability of medium/long term growth and reasonable valuations.</p> <p>The performance of each sector would be reviewed with the published data at quarterly rests with the objective of rebalancing of portfolio. Hence, the frequency of taking view on the sectors shall be once in a quarter based on published data and the policy for re-allocation shall be driven by changes in the growth rate of industries.</p>	

<b>Risk Profile of the Scheme</b>	<p>Scheme specific risk factors are summarized below:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The Scheme’s investment portfolio will be concentrated in select sectors only. This might lead to increased volatility in the movement of NAV.</li> <li>2. Equity instruments by nature are volatile and prone to price fluctuations on a daily basis due to both, micro and macro factors. Trading volumes, settlement periods and transfer procedures may restrict liquidity of investments in equity and equity related securities. Different segments of the Indian financial markets have different settlement periods, and such periods may be extended significantly by unforeseen circumstances. The length of the settlement may affect the schemes in the event that the Scheme has to meet an inordinately large number of redemptions.</li> <li>3. Derivatives products carry the credit risk (risk of default by counterparty), market risk (due to market movements) and liquidity risk (due to lack of liquidity in derivatives). No principal amount is exchanged. A notional principal amount is agreed upon for interest calculation purposes. Only the difference between the two rates is exchanged at agreed intervals or payment dates. When fixed interest rate amount is higher, the fixed rate payer pays the difference amount i.e. fixed interest rate amount minus the floating interest rate amount or vice-versa.</li> </ol>

The quantum of exposure shall be decided on the basis of relative earnings, growth, valuations and potential valuations. As the fund intends to hold less number of stocks than a diversified growth fund, the NAV volatility (risk) will be higher than normal.

	<u>Liquidity Risk</u>	Risk will be monitored in terms of the number of days it takes to liquidate every stock in the portfolio assuming a share of the average volume traded over the previous one year. Efforts would be made to keep the average liquidation period under prudent limits prescribed internally.

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**Half-Yearly Consolidated Account Statement:**

- A consolidated account statement detailing holding across all schemes at the end of every six months (i.e. September/ March), on or before 10<sup>th</sup> day of succeeding month, to all such Unitholders holding units in non- demat form in whose folios no transaction has taken place during that period shall be sent by mail/email.
- The half yearly consolidated account statement will be sent by e-mail to the Unit holders whose email address is registered with the Fund, unless a specific request is made to receive in physical.

Pursuant to SEBI circular SEBI/HO/IMD/DF2/CIR/P/2016/89 dated September 20, 2016, the following points have been incorporated to increase the transparency of information to the investors:

- (a) Each CAS issued to the investors shall also provide the total purchase value / cost of investment in each scheme.
- (b) Further, CAS issued for the half-year (ended September/ March) shall also provide:
  - (i) The amount of actual commission paid by AMCs/Mutual Funds (MFs) to distributors (in absolute terms) during the half-year period against the concerned investor's total investments in each MF scheme. The term 'commission' here refers to all direct monetary payments and other payments made in the form of gifts / rewards, trips, event sponsorships etc. by AMCs/MFs to distributors. Further, a mention may be made in such CAS indicating that the commission disclosed is gross commission and does not exclude costs incurred by distributors such as service tax (wherever applicable, as per existing rates), operating expenses, etc.
  - (ii) The scheme's average Total Expense Ratio (in percentage terms) for the half-year period for each scheme's applicable plan (regular or direct or both) where the concerned investor has actually invested in.
- (c) Such half-yearly CAS shall be issued to all MF investors, excluding those investors who do not have any holdings in MF schemes and where no commission against their investment has been paid to distributors, during the concerned half-year period. Any circular/clarification issued by SEBI in this regard will automatically become applicable and shall be incorporated in the SID/SAI/KIM wherever applicable.

**Applicable to Investors who opt to hold Units in Demat Form**

The AMC shall send an allotment confirmation specifying the units allotted by way of email and/or SMS within 5 Business Days of receipt of valid application/transaction to the Unit holders registered e-mail address and/or mobile number. The statement of holding of the beneficiary account holder for units held in demat will be sent by the respective DPs periodically.
